# Communication & Language

Ask the children questions about their own families and their experiences of the beach.

Place items you find at the seaside into a beach bag. You could add a beach towel, bucket, sun hat, inflatables, etc. Children can take it in turns to secretly choose and object. Without naming it, can they describe the object for their friends to guess what it is?

Using puppets, describe some 'problems' that have occurred at the seaside. Encourage children to talk about the problem and come up with ideas for how to solve it.
