WB 13th July Summer 2 Week 7 – Transition and friends

Weekly Maths Tasks

Monday	Today we are looking at doubling. When doubling, you are using the same number twice. Show your child the song for doubling. Have a go at using objects from around the house to represent numbers to 10 that have been doubled. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8jOzhiACB68
Tuesday	Have a go at this online doubling game: https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/archeryDoubles/index.html
Wednesday	Today focus on halving. When we halve a number, it has to have two equal amounts. Practise doing this with small items around your house, such as pasta.
Thursday	Ask your parents if you can share your snack with them by halving it. Remember, make sure both halves are equal! Watch this halving song first https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zqf34wx
Friday	Paint some scales on a blank rainbow fish template (you could draw a simple fish outline on some paper). Double the number of fish (and scales) by pressing another blank rainbow fish on top. The paint should have printed onto the paper creating two fish and double the number of scales!

Weekly Phonics Tasks

Monday	Play 'Flashcards' with all of the sounds you have learnt so far. Keep a record of your score. Can you beat it next time?
Tuesday	Play 'What am I?' describe different underwater animals to your child and they have to guess what animal you are describing.
Wednesday	Pour flour, rice or lentils into a shallow tray or plate. Show your child a letter/sound or tricky word and ask them to 'write it' in the food using their finger. Reception: Using your letter sounds (ar, or, air, ir, ou, oy), can you make a list of words using these sounds?
Thursday	Think of words to describe different underwater animals - each word should start with the same letter i.e. slippery seal, fantastic fish, terrific turtle..
Friday	Practice reading and listening to sounds by playing Odd Sound Out or practise reading their Tricky Words .

Weekly Reading Tasks

Monday	Read or listen to the story Rainbow Fish here (The children have used this book before in school so should be familiar). At one point in, the Rainbow Fish becomes the 'loneliest fish in the entire ocean'. Why do you think he is feeling lonely? Can you suggest things that he could do to find some friends?
Tuesday	Re-read or listen to the story Rainbow fish. The Rainbow Fish's scales 'shimmer'. Can you find other words that could be used to describe the scales?
Wednesday	Read/tell your favourite story to someone at home, a pet, a cuddly toy anyone. Remember this can be done just by using the pictures or telling a story from memory.
Thursday	Using underwater characters from the story of Rainbow Fish, can you make up your own story?
Friday	Get cosy and listen to a story together at home. Remember Audible is free to use. There are lots of stories on youtube and there are lots also on Oxford Owl Reading . Talk about the story together. What is happening on each page?

Weekly Writing Tasks

Monday	Ask your child to think about their favourite memory from school this year. It could be a trip or a game they've played. Can you draw a picture and label it with help from your adult.
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	Challenge: Can you write a few sentences to explain what they enjoyed the most and why.
Tuesday	Ask your child what their proudest achievement is this year. Can they design a medal for themselves and write about their achievement on the back. You could have a medal award ceremony to celebrate each other's achievements.
Wednesday	Ending the year means saying good bye to teachers and friends until next year, or sometimes longer. Talk to your child about the friendships they have made this year. Who is important to them and why? Support your child to draw around their hand on paper and then carefully cut it out. On the template, ask your child to draw or write a goodbye message to a friend or teacher. Challenge: On each finger, they could write the qualities that this special person has displayed over the year e.g. kindness, being helpful, etc.
Thursday	Ask your child to think about what makes them special. What makes them different to other people? You could ask other family members to contribute to this too and record a list of your child's individual qualities together.
Friday	Look again at the story of Rainbow Fish. What made him a good friend in the end? Challenge: Write a character description of him.
