

## Wark C of E First School Sports Premium Information 2016-17

The Government is providing £150 million per year, directly to schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The funding is ring-fenced and can be spent only on PE and sport provision in schools. Each school receives a lump sum of £8000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil for those children in Years 1-4. At Wark C of E First School we received **£8125 in 2015-2016**.
